Local projects wishing to be insured through AON must have in place:

Written volunteer pack presented to all volunteers with evidence that this is read and will be adhered to by the volunteer. The pack must include Code of Conduct, Police Protocol, Health and Safety and a Risk Assessment.

All volunteers to have an understanding of conflict awareness and the need for personal safety.

Volunteers must patrol in teams, must carry a radio or phone for communication and must wear an identifiable uniform when on patrol.

The Health and Safety document must be of a standard at least minimum to the one on www.sa-cni.org.uk
